WHEREAS, the late Willard "Bill" McClure was elected to serve as the then Town of Fruitland Park's Councilman during the periods of April 1959 to November 1960 and from December 1970 to October 1974; and

WHEREAS, Councilman McClure was appointed as the chair and member of numerous town committees; namely, fire, library, parks and recreation, beautification, and streets, and

WHEREAS, Bill McClure dedicated most of his time to advocate, on behalf of the citizens of Fruitland Park, for roadway improvements, cleanup and safety of the surrounding areas of Berckman Street which included the installation of stop signs, and

WHEREAS, Councilman McClure helped established the rate of Christmas bonus for town employees; travelled to South Florida to inspect a fire truck for the volunteer fire department; initiated the use of other advanced equipment for the police and fire departments, and encouraged training for the fire department staff safety; and

WHEREAS, as chair of the parks and recreation committee, Mr. McClure strove for needed funds towards restrooms, lights, and much needed equipment for the town's parks and the remodeling of the former Casino building; and

WHEREAS, Councilman McClure promoted the regional work experience for the (cadet) program in 1974 attracting college and pre-college students to the criminal justice bureau, and

WHEREAS, on May 9, 1975, Mr. McClure received a proclamation and on February 9, 1989, he was honored with a plaque recognizing him for 25 years of continuous service with the City of Fruitland Park Volunteer Fire department; and

WHEREAS, Bill McClure volunteered to serve as a member of the City's Board of Trustees of The Municipal Fire Fighters Pension Trust Fund from 1994 to 1998; and

WHEREAS, Bill has been known to those closest to him as "a very loyal, humble and soft-spoken person who did not have much to say and when he did, you might want to listen".

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED THAT I, Chris Cheshire, Mayor of the City of Fruitland Park on behalf of the City of Fruitland Park Commission, do hereby proclaim Thursday, May 28, 2019 as "WILLARD "BILL" McCLURE DAY" in the City of Fruitland Park; recognized his many years of tireless and devoted service which have left the city in a better place today and express sincere condolences to his family and loved ones.

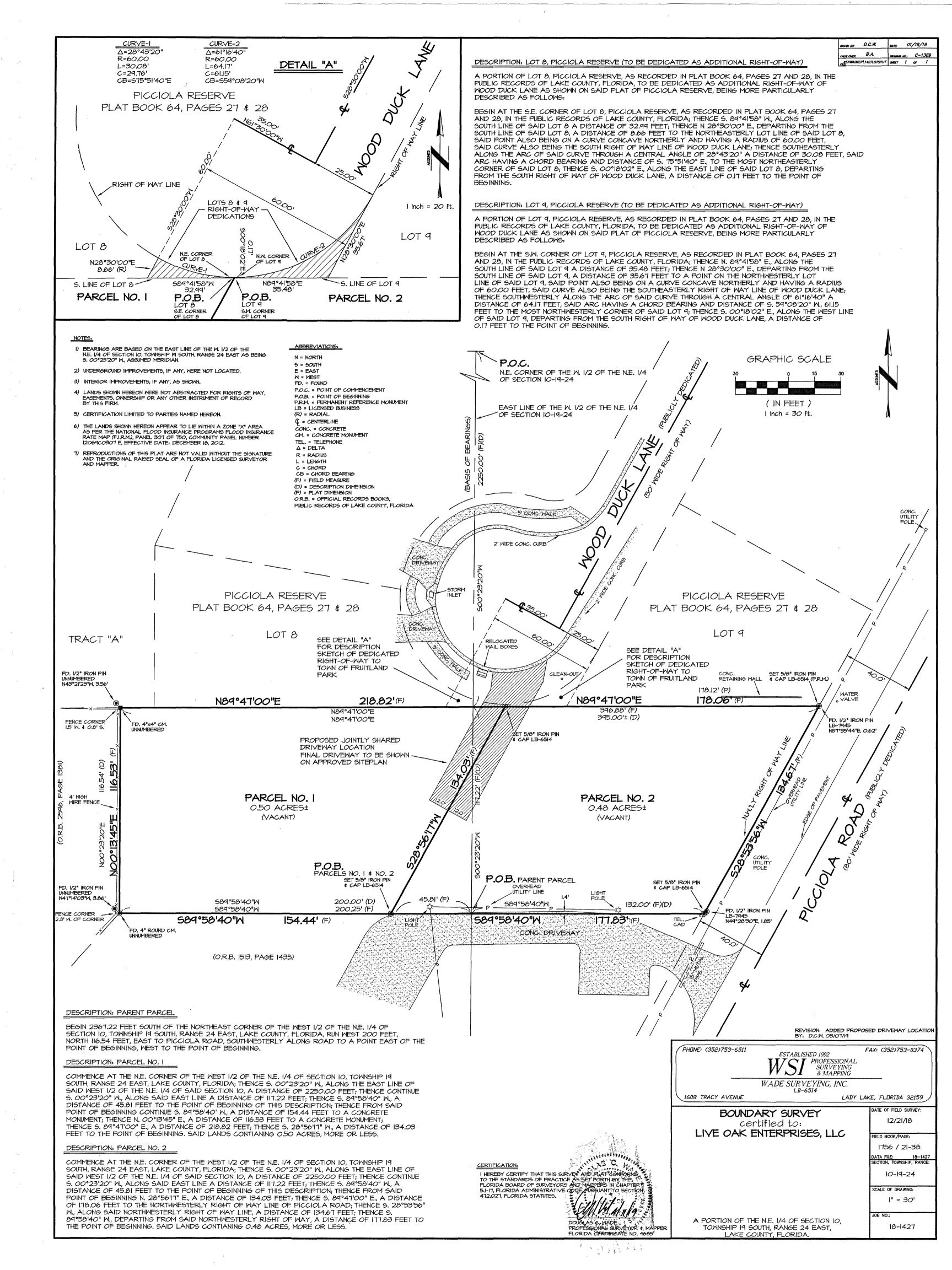

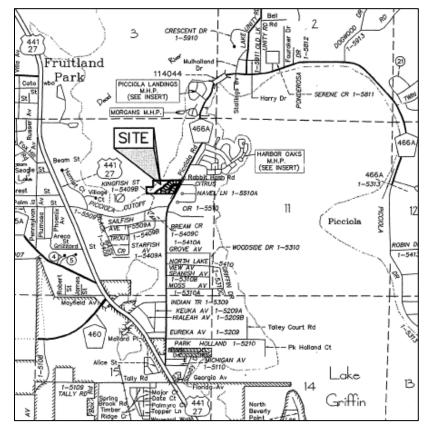

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF FRUITLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, FLORIDA; AMENDING SECTION 99.110, IN CHAPTER 99 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO AUTHORIZE THE ADOPTION OF FIRE INSPECTION FEES BY RESOLUTION; REPEALING FEES FOR BURN PERMITS; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE, SEVERABILITY AND CONFLICTS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to §633.216, Florida Statutes, the City has fire safety enforcement responsibilities and therefore is required to employ or contract with a fire safety inspector;

WHEREAS, the City Commission is authorized pursuant to §633.216, Florida Statutes to establish a schedule of fees to pay only the costs of inspections conducted pursuant to Florida law and related administrative expenses; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission has contracted with a fire safety inspector to perform plan review, annual inspections, as well as other duties, and is obligated to pay for these services; and

WHEREAS, the City no longer requires a burn permit; therefore, it is necessary to eliminate burn permit fees; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds it beneficial to the City to adopt miscellaneous user fees by resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of Fruitland Park, Lake County, Florida, as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.

Section 2. <u>Amendment.</u> Section 99.110 in Chapter 99 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fruitland Park, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 99.110. —Miscellaneous Fire Inspection fees.

- (A) The city is authorized to charge a <u>fire inspection</u> fee <u>to recover the costs of inspections</u> and related administrative expenses. for each of the uses of city property and each of the services set forth in subsection (B) below. Fees shall be established by resolution adopted by the City Commission.
- (B) The City imposes a fee for the following:
 - (1) Life Safety System Inspection
 - (2) Life Safety reinspection

- (3) Annual Commercial Occupant Inspection
- (4) Follow-up Annual Commercial Occupant Inspection

The uses of city property and services for which the city shall charge a fee is and the amount of the fee for each use or service are as follows:

Use or Service Fee

- (1) Burn permit (a maximum of two permits will be issued per year per property owner):
 - (a) Residential, per permit 10.00
 - (b) Commercial, per permit20.00
- (2) Mandated annual fire inspection for:
 - (a) Commercial uses, per annual inspection35.00
 - (b) Other required inspections, per inspection35.00
 - (c) First reinspection15.00
 - (d) Additional re-inspections, per reinspection15.00
- **Section 3.** <u>Inclusion in Code.</u> It is the intent of the Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the City of Fruitland Park Code and that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "article", or such other appropriate word "or phrase in order to accomplish such intentions.
- **Section 4.** <u>Severability.</u> If any section, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Ordinance is for any reason held or declared to be unconstitutional, inoperative or void, such holding or invalidity shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance; and it shall be construed to have been the Commissioner's intent to pass this Ordinance without such unconstitutional, invalid or inoperative part therein; and the remainder of this Ordinance, after the exclusion of such part or parts shall be deemed and held to be valid, as if such parts had not been included herein.
- **Section 5.** Conflicts. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
- **Section 6.** <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final adoption.

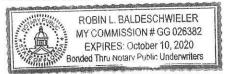

Gary,

As you are aware, the police department budgeted \$95000.00 in FY2019 budget for the purchase of two patrol vehicles. Back in November of 2018, I reassigned the vehicle that our detective was using due to that vehicle being patrol ready which would serve better use to our department as a road patrol vehicle. I then received permission to purchase a Detective packaged vehicle for a total of \$24100.00 after equipped with lights. The purchase of that vehicle brought the original \$95,000.00 down to where it is today at \$70,900.00.

We currently have one patrol unit on our lot that we can use as a spare. Once we fill the current opening, that option will no longer be available. We have the two original 2013 Ford SUV's that our agency bought in 2012. We also have a 2014 that is ready to be moved to the spare line due to mileage, wear and tear. One of the SUV's (white 2013), I would like to move to public works so Dale Bogle could issue it to his well operator.

As I spoke about with you briefly two weeks ago, I reviewed state bids for all manufactures of vehicles that offer patrol rated models. The vehicle that seems to be the best buy for the dollar is the 2019 Dodge Charger All Wheel Drive. I have attached the quote which is \$23096.00 per vehicle. I also reached out to Clermont Police Department and spoke with Captain McMasters about their satisfaction with the performance of the Dodge Chargers that they use. Captain McMasters stated that they originally had issues with front end problems but after switching to the all-wheel drive (AWD) models, they have had no further issues.

I obtained a quote today (05/14/19) from Prestige Ford, they have two Ford Taurus Interceptor Sedans that would be available for \$23500.00 per vehicle. This is a higher price than the Dodge Chargers but would allow us to stay consistent with Fords in our fleet.

I reached out to Hg2 Emergency Lighting which is the company that builds our vehicles; I received a quote from them of \$8519.00 per vehicle. This is approximately \$4500.00 cheaper per vehicle than the SUV's they built for us last year. To further the savings, I asked Sergeant Cox to reach out to other video system providers to see what was new on the market. We have used the same video system (Apollo) for the last 7 years. Sergeant Cox located a company called Pro-Vision that offers in-car video systems for law enforcement purposes. The Pro-Vision system offers great technology which will require much less storage than the Apollo system. The price for the Pro-Vision system is \$3060.00 per vehicle. This is approximately \$1500.00 dollars cheaper per vehicle than the Apollo system that we currently use.

With a current available budget of \$70,900 for vehicles, the attached quotes would allow us to purchase two patrol cars for \$70,462.00 if we used the Ford price. It is my opinion that this would be a safe and necessary purchase for our department. This allows us to issue a vehicle to the new hire, and still have two back-up vehicles on the lot.

Traffic Study

Conservation Trail at Kauska Way

April/May 2019

In April of 2019, City Manager La Venia requested that the police department conduct a traffic study at the intersection of Conservation Trail and Kauska Way.

The purpose of the study was to determine whether or not the intersection was properly marked as a two-way stop rather than a four-way stop; and if not, what would be the recommended adjustment in the area of traffic control devices.

Officer Jeremiah Ricketts and Officer John Simone were asked to conduct traffic enforcement operation at the mentioned intersection and to document their results and observations. I, Chief Luce have received five reports from their efforts. After reviewing the reports, my opinion is as follows:

During the officer's 24.25 hours dedicated across five details, it is obvious that Conservation Trail has a very heavy traffic flow. Kauska Way however has a very minimal traffic flow. As currently marked with a two-way stop sign, Conservation Trail is required to stop at the intersection. Kauska Way is not required to stop at this intersection.

The traffic flow on Conservation Trail was approximately 887 vehicles approaching the intersection. This would not include any vehicle traffic that took place while the officer was on a traffic stop and unable to observe the intersection. Of the 887 vehicles, 33 vehicles (automobile and golf cart) committed a traffic violation at the intersection. This equals 3.75% of the vehicles observed on Conservation Trail during the observation hours committed a traffic violation.

The traffic flow on Kauska Way during the same hours of operation had 290 vehicles approach the intersection. There were no observed violations committed by the drivers of those 290 vehicles.

Please keep in mind that the numbers above are only from an average of 5.5 hours a day. The actual traffic usage will be much higher which would affect the number of violations committed.

I believe with the minimal traffic utilizing Kauska Way compared to the considerably higher amount of traffic on Conservation Trail and the amount of violations committed by the drivers on Conservation Trail; this intersection could be converted to a four way stop which should be affective in reducing the chance of a vehicle crash in the future. During the hours of our operation, only 20% of the vehicles utilizing this intersection were on Kauska Way. Which shows that the four way stop would not inconvenience many vehicles but could prevent one motor vehicle vs golf car crash that could result in a fatality.

RESOLUTION 2013 -023

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FRUITLAND PARK, FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR A PUBLIC PARTICIPATION POLICY WITH REGARD TO MEETINGS OF CITY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Commission wishes to adopt a public participation policy for meetings of the City's boards and commissions; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission accordingly desires to pass this Resolution 2013-023 to do so.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FRUITLAND PARK, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The following Public Participation Policy shall apply to meetings of City boards or commissions as provided herein.

Sec. 1. <u>Citizen's Rights</u>

- (a) <u>Definition.</u> For the purposes of this section, "board or commission" means a board or commission of the City of Fruitland Park.
 - (b) Right to be Heard: Members of the public shall be given a reasonable opportunity to be heard on a proposition before a City board or commission except as provided for below. Public input shall be limited to three (3) minutes. This right does not apply to:
 - 1. An official act that must be taken to deal with an emergency situation affecting the public health, welfare, or safety, if compliance with the requirements would cause an unreasonable delay in the ability of the board or commission to act;
 - 2. An official act involving no more than a ministerial act, including, but not limited to, approval of minutes and ceremonial proclamations;
 - A meeting that is exempt from §286.011; or
 - 4. A meeting during which the Commission is acting in a quasi-judicial capacity. This paragraph does not affect the right of a person to be heard as otherwise provided by law.

Sec. 2. Suspension and Amendment of these Rules

- (a) <u>Suspension of these Rules</u>: Any provision of these rules not governed by the City Charter or City Code may be temporarily suspended by a vote of a majority of the Commission.
- (b) Amendment of these Rules: These rules may be amended or new rules adopted by resolution.

(c) <u>Effect of Variance from Rules</u>: The failure to follow this Public Participation Policy shall not be grounds for invalidating any otherwise lawful act of the City's boards or commissions.

<u>Section 2</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Resolution.

Section 3. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon passage.
