01. PUBLIC HEARINGS -

(a)Adoption of Resolution 2013-019 tentative millage rate for the 2013/2014 Fiscal Year. Mayor asked is now was the time for making a change. Scott Gerken (CA) stated that yes, it would be. Scott mentioned that the current rate is much lower than the proposed. Mr. Conner (ICM) stated that the proposed 4.8172millage rate can then go to the roll back rate of 4.7371. Mr. Conner stated that would be a \$12,015.24 drop with no increase.

Vice Mayor Kelly asked that with this millage rate will the budget be covered. Mr. Conner stated that yes, it will.

02.<u>CITY MANAGER'S REPORT –</u> Mr. Conner stated he had nothing and would like to pass on to the City Attorney.

03.<u>CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT</u> – Scott Gerken stated that we have receive a settlement offer in the Richardson Federal Harassment case against the City. The settlement is for the City to pay Mr. Richardson \$ 232,000. Scott stated that this will go to the Insurance company, so nothing would have to be done at this point. The offer is open till September 20th.

The second issue is the ongoing lawsuit on the Police and Fire fees. The judge's order approved certification to move ahead as a class. There will be notices that will be sent to every citizen that has paid fees letting them know there is a class act. The second part of the order rejected Mr. Richardson as a proposed class representative and was not suitable to represent the class pending his lawsuit with the City. Mr. and Mrs. Howard will represent the City.

Mayor Bell asked what would happen if the Howard's removed themselves from representing the lawsuit.

Scott Gerken stated that if that happened someone would have to step in to represent the class suit. You must have a class representative.

03. <u>CONSENT AGENDA</u>: Approval of minutes from July 11, 2013, July 18, 2013, August 5, 2013, August 6, 2013 and August 7, 2013. Budget Amendment – Emergency Repair of Fire Apparatus and Budget Amendment for Library Books. Motion made by Vice Mayor Kelly, seconded by Commissioner Goldberg. Motion passed unanimously.

03.OLD BUSINES:

(a)- Purchase of Three Police Vehicles. Rick Conner (ICM) stated that every year you should put in the budget to purchase a vehicle and not purchase all your vehicles in one year.

Vice Mayor Kelly asked how long these vehicles will last.

Chief Isaacs stated that minimum would be five to seven years.

Commissioner Gunter asked if the cars come complete with required equipment except the radios.

Chief Isaacs stated that they do.

- (b) Authorization of City Holidays. Rick Conner stated that the City of Fruitland Park is behind on holidays. Most of the Cities grant 11 holidays a year and some grant 10 holidays while Fruitland Park grants only 8. Mr. Conner has asked the Council for three holidays: Veterans Day, Martin Luther King, and Presidents Day.

Mayor Bell stated he would like to give the employees Veterans Day and Martin Luther King but not sure about President's Day.

Commissioner Gunter stated it took him over 30 years to get two days off, but knowing we are the only City with 8 holidays he would agree to Veterans Day and Martin Luther King. A lot of companies go with a PTO program which is personal days off instead of holidays.

(c) First reading of Ordinance 2013-003 – Revising the City's water Rates. Scott stated that several years ago you suggested we review the rates annually, this is what this Ordinance will do, like a cost of living increase. The water rates will go from \$15.81 to \$16.11 that is a \$.30 increase.
